Please note: Any classroom/school-level/departmental operational concern by-passing any of the levels listed below, (Example: sharing a concern with the Superintendent and/or Board Members while bypassing Teacher, Principal, Assistant Superintendent or Departmental Supervisor, and Deputy or Chief) will be forwarded to the appropriate level to be addressed within the protocol.
